Environmental educator, artist, and recycling consultant, Nancy Judd, began her artistic creations in 2000. She has been the Recycling Coordinator for the City of Santa Fe, New Mexico, and the Executive Director of the New Mexico Recycling Coalition, and founded the Recycle Santa Fe Art Market and Fashion show. In 2006, Ms Judd won the Portland, OR, "Junk To Funk" Fashion Show.
